The Motus Wildlife Tracking System is an international collaborative research network that uses coordinated radio-telemetry arrays to study movements of small flying animals including birds, bats, and insects. These small-bodied animals have been challenging to study in the past because other tracking devices are too large for them to carry. Motus arrays are made up of automated radio telemetry receiving stations that detect signals from tiny tags worn by animals. The stations are deployed and maintained by collaborators around the world. Information collected helps fill critical data gaps on wildlife movement and behavior. Seabird and bat researchers from the USGS Western Ecological Research Center have teamed up to leverage Motus to study how flying animals move through the marine environment. They are in the process of adding 25 remote telemetry stations to the existing global Motus Wildlife Tracking System along the coast and offshore of Central and Southern California. They aim to foster collaboration with a variety of partners to enhance wildlife tracking capacity in the Pacific Region.
